All roles are paid contract positions with seasonal or annual terms.

Bookkeeper (Contract Position)

We're hiring a **contract bookkeeper** to support our Treasurer with the league's financial records. This is intended to be a **one-year contract from the hire date, renewable annually**.

A laptop with QuickBooks (non-profit edition) and Microsoft Office.

You provide:

A printer, paper, and (ideally) a scanner.

Main tasks include:

Entering deposits and payments into KCL's financial statements.

Reconciling bank and other accounts.

Preparing statements for Board meetings.

Completing AGLC reporting and tracking grants.

Preparing year-end working papers for accountants.

Training is available, and we have a binder that walks you through our processes. Ongoing support will also be provided.

Hall Coordinator (Contract Position)

We're looking for a **contract hall coordinator** to oversee the Community League Hall and coordinate hall rentals. This role focuses on regular building checks, light maintenance, and communication with renters and contractors.

Key duties include:

Checking the hall every 48 hours (water, heat, filters, emergency lights, AEDs).

Sanitizing high-touch areas and ensuring spaces are ready for programs or rentals.

Coordinating annual fire inspections and ordering supplies.

Managing hall rental inquiries, bookings, deposits, and walkthroughs.

Serving as the main contact for Telsco, fire inspections, garbage services, and other facility needs.

Contract timeframe:

Seasonal contract: November 2025 - March 2026 (renewable yearly)

Estimated 5–10 hours/week, depending on rentals and building needs

Ice Rink Master (Maker) - Contract Position

We're hiring a **contract Ice Rink Master** to handle building and maintaining the quality of the ice surfaces at the community rink.

Key duties include:

Building and maintaining ice on two outdoor rinks throughout the season.

Operating and maintaining snow removal and flooding equipment.

Clearing snow from walkways around the hall and rink areas.

Performing seasonal prep (before opening) and clean-up (end of season).

Coordinating with the Rink Attendant and board on rink conditions and maintenance needs.

Snow removal may be required outside of ice maintenance and should be billed separately at a reduced rate (to be agreed with the board).

Hours may vary depending on weather and ice conditions.

Contract timeframe:

Seasonal contract: **November 2025 – March 2026** (weather dependent)

Expected average 10–15 hours/week

Ice Rink Attendant (Contract Position)

We're hiring a **contract Ice Rink Attendant** to supervise the rink building during open hours and support safe, enjoyable use of the rink.

Key duties include:

Opening and closing the rink building during scheduled hours.

Monitoring rink users and encouraging safe skating practices.

Assisting with light snow clearing and reporting any equipment or facility issues.

Keeping the rink building tidy and welcoming for visitors.

Providing updates to the board about attendance and any incidents.

Rink and Building Hours:

Weekdays: 4:00 pm – 9:00 pm Saturdays: 12:00 pm – 8:00 pm Sundays: 12:00 pm – 5:00 pm

During school breaks: Saturday hours apply (except Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve,

when hours are 12:00 pm - 3:00 pm).

No service is expected on statutory holidays. 48 hours' notice will be provided if Kensington Elementary School plans to use the ice.

Hours may vary depending on weather and ice conditions.

Playground and Park Update

At the time of writing, fingers are still crossed hoping the League will receive \$125,000 from a Federal Government Accessibility Grant. We have been advised, due to the large number of proposals received, there was not sufficient funding to move forward with our project at this time. However, should funds become available, we would be contacted to discuss our continued eligibility.

The staff of the Federal Edmonton Centre Constituency Office closely tracked the progress of the decision making on this program. They have been asked to determine the likelihood of more funds becoming available. They are aware, since the filing of our application significant funding has been received, so now we have over 80 per cent of our funding in place. Receiving the \$125,000 would guarantee a Spring of 2026 installation of the new playground.

The Area One Bingos fund the Community Swims at Grand Trunk that are admission free to Kensington Community League members on Friday Evenings (7:15 - 9:15 pm), Sunday Afternoons (4:15 to 5:45 pm) and Drop in Agafit on Wednesday mornings from 8:00 to 10:00 am.

You can earn credits towards sports paid programs at the League's Bingos.

For the Afternoon Bingos the time commitment is from 11:00 am to 3:30 pm. For the Evening Bingos (the formats are exactly the same) the time commitment is from 5:00 pm to 9:30 pm.

As volunteer workers you have a 20-minute meal break. In appreciation for you working for the League you are provided with a meal allowance at the Bingo's Concession

At each Bingo we need to cover the following positions:

Chair - responsible for entire Bingo event and has to be prepared to cover a position if something happens during an event for example a worker becoming ill

Bonanza Controller - records the number of cards assigned to floor sellers and the funds turned in from the sale of the cards.

Paymaster - sells Early Bird cards and pays out the winnings to the Bingo patrons

Sheets -hands out paper for Bingo patrons to play the bingo series

Floor Sellers - purposeful walking to get your steps in! wear comfortable shoes Speedo & Flip - selling two games at \$1 a card

Bonanza & 50/50 - selling two games at \$1 a card

Double Action/Even Better/649 Baseball -selling three games at \$2 a card **Pull Tab Sellers** -selling pull tabs for \$1

All floor sellers are also responsible for the calling back of Bingos, taking the patron's receipt to the Paymaster to collect the player's winnings and returning the receipt and winnings to the patron.


